**CONSENT AGREEMENT**

The Arizona State Board of Nursing ("Board") and Bradshaw Mountain High School Nursing Assistant Program ("Respondent" or "Program") seek to resolve allegations that Respondent violated the Nurse Practice Act. In the interest of a prompt and speedy settlement; it of the above-captioned matter, consistent with the public interest, statutory requirements and the responsibilities of the Board, and pursuant to A.R.S. § 41-1092.07(F)(5), the undersigned parties enter into this Consent Agreement as a final disposition of this matter.

Based on the evidence before it, the Board makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law:

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. Respondent holds Board-issued program approval for a nursing assistant program, operating in Prescott Valley, Arizona, receiving its original approval in 2005. Respondent's last program approval was on May 21, 2026.
2. Respondent's Nursing Assistant (NA) program's first time student pass rate on the State of Arizona mandated written and manual skills certifying examinations were below the minimum requirement as required in R4-19-801(E) in 2025. According to D&S Diversified Technologies, the Board-approved test vendor, Respondent's annual pass rate for the written exam in 2025 was 76% and the skills was 60%. The Arizona State average for the 2025 calendar

year was 82.56% for written and 87.40% for the skills exam. Programs falling below the standard are those with less than 62.56% on the written exam and 67.40% on skills. The program tested 25 students.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Pursuant to A.R.S. §§ 32-1606, 32-1644, 32-1663, and 32-1664, the Board has subject matter and personal jurisdiction in this matter.

The conduct and circumstances described in the Findings of Fact constitute violations of A.R.S. § 32-1663 (D) as defined in correctly cited as § 32-1601(27) "Unprofessional conduct" includes the following whether occurring in this state or elsewhere: (d) Any conduct or practice that is or might be harmful or dangerous to the health of a patient or the public and (j) Violating this chapter or a rule that is adopted by the board pursuant to this chapter (effective August 9, 2017); and A.A.C. R4-19-801 (E) Certifying Exam Passing Standard: A training program and each site of a consolidated program under R4-19-802(E) shall attain, at a minimum, an annual first-time passing rate on the manual skill and written certifying examinations that is equal to the Arizona average pass rate for all candidates on each examination minus 20 percentage points. The Board may waive this requirement for programs with less than five students taking the exam during the year. The Board shall issue a notice of deficiency under R4-19-805 to any program with five or more students taking the exam that fails to achieve the minimum passing standard in any calendar year.

The conduct and circumstances described in the Findings of Fact constitute sufficient cause pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-1664(P) to revoke, suspend or take other disciplinary action against Respondent's program approval in the State of Arizona.

Respondent admits the Board's Findings of Fact and the Conclusions of Law.

Respondent understands that the Board does substantiate all of the facts in this agreement and that those findings may be used as prior discipline history in any future actions by the Board.

In lieu of a formal hearing on these issues, Respondent agrees to issuance of the attached Order and waives all rights to a hearing, rehearing, appeal or judicial review relating to this matter. Respondent further waives any and all claims or causes of action, whether known or unknown, that Respondent may have against the State of Arizona, the Board, its members, officers, employees and/or agents arising out of this matter.

Respondent understands that all investigative materials prepared or received by the Board concerning these violations and all notices and pleadings relating thereto may be retained in the Board's file concerning this matter.

Respondent understands that the Board finds that the Findings of Fact are conclusive evidence of a violation of the Nurse Practice Act and may be used for purposes of determining sanctions in any future disciplinary matter.

Respondent understands the right to consult legal counsel prior to entering into this Consent Agreement and such consultation has either been obtained or is waived.


Respondent understands that this Consent Agreement is effective upon its acceptance by the Board and by Respondent as evidenced by the respective signatures thereto. Respondent's signature obtained via facsimile shall have the same effect as an original signature. Once signed by Respondent, the Agreement cannot be withdrawn without the Board's approval or by stipulation between Respondent and the Board's designee. The effective date of this Order is the date the Consent Agreement is signed by the Board and by Respondent. If the Consent Agreement is signed on different dates, the later date is the effective date.

Respondent acknowledges and agrees that the acceptance of this Consent Agreement is solely to settle this Board matter and does not preclude the Board from instituting other proceedings as may be appropriate now or in the future.

Furthermore, and notwithstanding any language in this Consent Agreement, this Consent Agreement does not preclude in any way any other state agency or officer or political subdivision of this state from instituting proceedings, investigating claims, or taking legal action as may be appropriate now or in the future relating to this matter or other


matters concerning Respondent, including but not limited to, violations of Arizona's Consumer Fraud Act. Respondent acknowledges that, other than with respect to the Board, this Consent Agreement makes no representations, implied or otherwise, about the views or intended actions of any other state agency or officer or political subdivision of the state relating to this matter or other matters concerning Respondent.

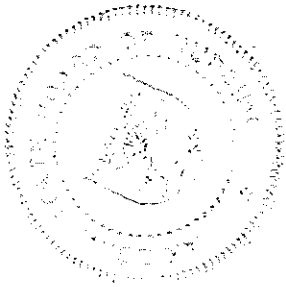

**ORDER**

In view of the above Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and the consent of Respondent, the Board hereby issues the following Order:

- A. Respondent's consent to the terms and conditions of the Order and waiver of public hearing is accepted.
- B. Respondent's program approval is placed on probation for a minimum 18 months with terms and conditions. Prior to the termination of probation, the program must have

enrolled students and conduct regular program operations, including didactic and clinical sessions, for a minimum of 18 months.

C. If Respondent is noncompliant with any of the terms of the Order, Respondent's noncompliance shall be reviewed by the Board for consideration of possible further discipline on Respondent's nursing program.

D. While this Order is in effect and/or Respondent's approval is subject to discipline, up to and including revocation or voluntary surrender, Respondent is not eligible to renew any other expired approval previously held by Respondent without prior review and approval by the Board.

E. This Order becomes effective upon the Board and Respondent's acceptance of the Consent Agreement. The effective date of this Order is the date the Consent Agreement is signed by the Board and by Respondent. If the Consent Agreement is signed on different dates, the latter is the effective date. Probation is to commence the effective date of this Order.

F. At any time Respondent is required by terms of the Order to provide a copy of the Order to another individual, entity, or facility, Respondent must provide all pages of the Order.

G. The probation is subject to the following terms and conditions:

### **TERMS OF PROBATION**

#### **1. Notification of Public**

Within seven days of the effective date of this Order, the Board shall note the probationary status of the program on the list of approved programs with the following notation: "VOLUNTARY CONSENT FOR PROBATION." Additionally the Board shall provide public access to this order through its website

#### **2. Admissions Report**

Notify the Board at least 15 days before the start of each cohort with the dates the cohort starts and finishes, number of students admitted to the cohort, students names, and faculty names who

will be teaching each section, didactic, skills and clinical, with instructor to student ratios included for each portion of the class.

### 3. Semester Reports

Respondent to provide a written report at the end of each semester and an end of the year report. Semester Reports will be due June 30, 2026 and January 30, 2027, and June 30, 2027 and the end of the year report will be due July 30, 2027. Please include the following information:

### 4. Semester Reports Shall Include

- Admissions
- Attrition
- Completion rates
- Curriculum changes
- Grievances/complaints – Any written or verbal complaints or concerns regarding the nursing program brought to the attention of the nursing program administrator and their resolution including informal complaints and comments on evaluations
- Personnel changes
- All policy revisions
- Timely notification of any program changes that are or may be in violation of this agreement
- D&S pass rates
- Final skills grades for each student, please include mock skill testing scores and remediation done for any students
- Please list any barriers to the skills, what skills were a challenge for the students and any changes you made involving the skills.

### 5. Release of Information Forms

Respondent Program shall cause an authorized program representative to sign all release of information forms as required by the Board or its designee and return them to the Board within

10 days of the Board's written request. Failure to provide for the release of information, as required by this paragraph constitutes noncompliance with this Order.

6. Interview with the Board or Its Designee

Respondent's representative shall appear in person for interviews with the Board or its designee upon request at various intervals and with reasonable notice.

7. Renewal of Approval

In the event Respondent's Associate Nursing Degree program approval is expired or is scheduled to expire while this Order is in effect, Respondent shall apply for renewal of the approval and otherwise maintain approval for an Associate Nursing Degree program in Arizona.

8. Obey All Laws

Respondent shall obey all laws/rules governing nursing education in this state and obey all federal, state and local criminal laws. Respondent shall report to the Board, within 10 days, any violation or potential violation of the Nurse Practice Act, Board of Nursing Rules or any federal, state or criminal laws.

9. Costs

Respondent shall bear all costs of complying with this Order.

10. Violation of Probation

If Respondent Program is noncompliant with this Order in any respect, the Board or its designee may notify Respondent Program's accreditation agency, including the institutional accrediting agency, of the non-compliance. Additionally, the Board may revoke probation and take further disciplinary action for noncompliance with this Order after affording Respondent Program notice and the opportunity to be heard. If a complaint or petition to revoke probation is filed against Respondent Program during probation, the Board shall have continuing jurisdiction until the matter is final, and the period of probation shall be extended until the matter is final.

11. Voluntary Surrender of Approval

Respondent may, at any time this Order is in effect, voluntarily request surrender of their program approval.

12. Completion of Order

Respondent is eligible for early termination of this Order. Upon successful completion of the terms of probation or after 18 months of compliance, Respondent may request formal review by the Board, and after formal review by the Board, Respondent's approval may be fully restored by the appropriate Board action if compliance with this Order has been demonstrated.
